About this clinical trial

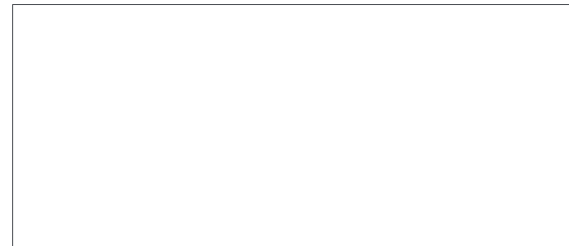
This migraine trial will help doctors and scientists learn if a study medicine, called rimegepant, can prevent migraine attacks in children and teenagers.

If the trial is a good fit for your child, they will begin by receiving the study medicine or a placebo for 3 months. A placebo does not have any medicine in it but looks just like the medicine being studied.

After the initial 3 month period, your child may also have the opportunity to continue participation and receive the study medicine for up to 12 months. During this second phase everyone will receive the study medicine rimegepant (and not a placebo).

Who can take part

Your child might be able to take part in this trial if they are 6-17 years of age* and:



Have been diagnosed with migraine for at least 6 months by a healthcare provider



Experience migraine on 6 or more days per month



Have migraine attacks that last for 4 to 72 hours, on average, when they are not treated

There will be other requirements that the trial team will discuss with you.

Diversity in trial participants is important in order to understand how potential migraine medicines work in different people. Race, ethnicity, age, and sex can all impact how different people respond to the same treatment.

When you and your child participate in a trial, you're helping to represent both your community and all people who are affected by migraine. Your child's participation could make a difference.

How long will participants be in this trial?



About 6 months (participants may be able to join a second phase of the trial which lasts 12 months)

How many visits are required?



About 10 visits (or 25 including the second phase)

How long do visits last?



Most visits last for about 1½ to 2 hours

One visit may take place over the phone or be conducted virtually

Your journey and your choice

Participant safety is the top priority of this clinical trial. Before your child participates, you will both be given all the details about the trial, including potential benefits and risks of taking part. Your child's health will also be monitored by the trial team while in the trial.

If this trial is a good fit for you and your child and you decide to have your child take part, it's important to remember that this is your and your child's journey and choice. Your child is free to stop being in this trial at any time for any reason.

Trial-related costs are covered

The study medicine and any trial-related procedures are generally covered at no cost. Participants do not need health insurance to take part. Participants and/or their caregivers will be reimbursed for any reasonable expenses that they may have as a result of taking part in this trial. This may include parking, meals, or other travel-related expenses.
